**New Outbreak Health Orders:
November 16**

No 1	Suspension of Regulations and Statutes	Suspends certain regulations and statutes to allow agencies to best address the COVID-19 emergency
No 2	Telehealth & Courtesy Occupational Licenses	Authorizes telemedicine, access to licensees from other jurisdictions, and flexibility to certain licensing boards
No 3	Virtual Meetings & Electronic Communications for Boards	Allows business to be conducted virtually and via electronic communications for boards of corporations, non-profit, and ANCs
No 4	Non-Congregate Sheltering	Provides FEMA reimbursement eligibility for temporary sheltering and quarantine
No 5	Critical Infrastructure	Provides guidance for critical infrastructure workers. Appendices specifically address: commercial fishing, independent harvesters, and seafood processing plants
No 6	International & Interstate Travel	Provides guidelines for residents and non-residents traveling into Alaska
No 7	Online Raffles & Prize Drawings	Allows charitable gaming permittees to conduct raffles, lotteries and other contests online
No 8	Intrastate Travel	11/16: Specifies the limitations on community restrictions, and that Critical Infrastructure must be allowed to travel into rural towns but follow safety plans. Defines Critical personal needs for residents that need to leave communities. 11/21: Implements testing strategy and protocols for individuals traveling from road system communities to off-road system.
